He was a normal, happy-go-lucky boy who loved nature and football and had no reason not to think his whole life lay ahead of him.

But four days later, accompanied by his mother Winnie, Keith left home to walk to his grandmother's house.

Winnie saw him safely across the zebra crossing on Manchester's busy Stockport Road and waved him goodbye. His short journey took him past Westmoreland Street – home of Ian Brady.

From a nearby parked car, a woman called to Keith, asking if he would mind helping her move some boxes. Keith hesitated for a moment, spotting the man sitting in the back seat of the vehicle.

The woman assured him that the man was her boyfriend, and also helping with the boxes. Keith, ever obliging, agreed to give them a hand and climbed into the front passenger seat of the car.

Instead of collecting boxes from an off-licence, followed by a lift home as promised, Brady and Hindley drove Keith to Saddleworth Moor. They stopped at a small layby and walked him down a ravine. There, while Hindley acted as lookout for anyone walking on the moor, Brady assaulted and murdered the young boy before burying him in a lonely grave.

It was not until the following morning that Keith's family realized he was missing, for neither household owned a telephone. Winnie presumed her son was with his grandmother, while Keith's grandmother assumed that he had stayed at home for the night. Their nightmare had just begun. It continues to this day, as it will until Keith is found.
